Asian Studies Minor at Eastern Connecticut State University is currently accepting submissions for the Asian Studies Expo, an exhibition of student's research and creative activities on the topics of Asia, Asian Influence, and Asians in the U.S. The Expo will be held from Nov. 9 to Nov. 15 at the Student Gallery at Wood Support Center 2nd floor.

Please read the following general guidelines before submitting.

You must be a current student of Eastern Connecticut State University.

Your research or artwork must be about Asia, Asian Influence, and Asians in the U.S. in the form of the following.

- Art / Craft / Literature (If the artwork is not a digital file, please upload a high-resolution photo of the art piece. You will have to drop off the actual art piece during the drop-off period)
- Recorded Music or Performance (Only accepting digital recording or documentation. MP4 or link to Youtube or Vimeo)
- Research poster or media presentation(Only accepting digital recording or documentation. PDF or link to Youtube or Vimeo)

You can make multiple submissions, as long as you provide separate submissions for each separate project.

Detailed Submission Guidelines

Visual Art & Craft

- up to three .jpg or .png images in 300 dpi (print resolution of width and height less than 24") submitted as separate files.
- an information sheet identifying each piece by title, media, year, and dimensions
- may include but are not limited to: painting, drawing, illustration, photographs, film stills, design work, fiber/textile arts (as photographs/scans), collage, sculpture (as photographs), ceramics (as photographs), and graphic novels/comic book excerpts/panels

Literature / Research Poster

- PDFs are preferred, but .doc or .docx are allowed.

- Maximum document size(width or length) is 24".
- If published on the web, please provide a link.
